Art History Internship Course (ARTH 395)

Agnes regularly works with internship students who are interested in the various aspects of museum research, interpretive programs for exhibition development, engagement with our collection and operations. This undergraduate internship in a professional museum environment offers insight into the process of curatorial projects from conception through research and installation; along with the development of public programs and community engaged gatherings. The internship may consist of a new research project or an assigned activity in conjunction with an ongoing program. The research project will be developed in consultation with the supervising instructor and activities tasked alongside Agnes's collections or programming. The internship requires that the student work onsite at the gallery for 6 hours per week through a single semester. Additional research hours might be required. Internships may take place in the fall, winter or spring/summer semester.

Students in Art History and Fine Art can apply to take a practical internship in a museum or gallery, where they would undertake research or curatorial activities. All internships must be approved in advance by written application to the Undergraduate Chair. Approval will depend on the quality of the proposal and the academic record of the applicant. Students are required to write a report about their experience and are evaluated jointly by the employer and a faculty member from the Department of Art.
